## **Southern Arts Federation Awards \$27,975 to Alabama Arts Organizations**

Atlanta, GA - The Southern Arts Federation (SAF) announces a total of \$27,975 awarded to Alabama arts organizations for fiscal year 2008-09 in fee support to present touring artists. Through the NEA/SAF Regional Touring program, the National Endowment for the Arts and the Southern Arts Federation partner to offer nonprofit presenting organizations fee support to present artists from outside of their states. Touring support is awarded for theatre, music, opera, musical theatre, literary and dance projects that contain both a public performance and an educational component. Alabama grant recipients, location, amount and program funded are:

- **Alabama Dance Council, Birmingham**, \$7,500 for Complexions Contemporary Ballet
- **Knox Concert Series**, Anniston, \$5,000 for Dublin Philharmonic Orchestra
- **Mobile International Festival**, Mobile, \$1,500 for Maturiza Taiko Drumming
- **Mobile Symphony**, Mobile, \$2,500 for Midori
- **Mobile Symphony**, Mobile, \$1,225 for Mark Yu
- **Princess Theatre Center for the Performing Arts**, Decatur, \$5,250 for Diavolo
- **Princess Theatre Center for the Performing Arts**, Decatur, \$5,000 for The Paper Bag Players

Presenting organizations from SAF's nine-state region competed for a total of \$371,981 in Regional Touring funding. Grants were awarded to 125 projects which are expected to reach 300,000 individuals, including more than 105,000 K-12 students. A total of 709 performances and educational activities will be provided throughout the region.
